Shine on, Harvest Moon was one of a series of moon related Tin Pan Alley songs of the early 20th century. Credited to Jack Norworth and his wife Nora Bayes, the song was debuted by the composers in the Ziegfeld Follies of 1908 and was an instant hit.

Frequently recorded over the following 40 years, it became an American classic and is occasionally still recorded today. The most recent recording I have is Bobby Bare's 2006 album, "The Moon was Blue."-Ed.
