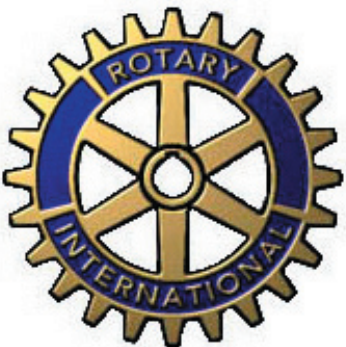

to make well, then adopt, between 100-120 treatable animals each month. Sadly, in some cases (underage animals who cannot survive in a shelter environment, animals that have proven to be aggressive or those with injuries beyond our means to treat given the fact that we receive close to 25 dogs and cats daily!) all we can provide is a painless ending when resources have been exhausted.

Educational programs, outreach clinics, and partnerships with other organizations bring our services to the many animals who never set paw in our shelter.

We hold a monthly support group for those grieving the loss of a loved companion, assist county residents who face the daunting task of finding pet-friendly rental housing, offer multiple levels of obedience classes, offer a speakers bureau, and investigate hundreds of cruelty calls. PHS/SPCA is much more than a shelter. It's a place where dedicated professionals and volunteers share their passion, talent and commitment in service to the animals and people in the diverse communities that make up San Mateo County.

Holly is proud to be a Rotarian. She and her husband, Keith, are both members of the Rotary Club of Marin Evening. Holly served as President of her club in 1998-99. She also served as Club Community Service Chair and Club International Service Chair for Marin Evening. Before being selected as District Governor, Holly served two years as Assistant District Governor and a third year as District 5150 Chief of Staff. In addition to being Paul Harris Fellows, Benefactors and members of the Rotary Bequest Society, Holly and Keith are also Major Donors to the Rotary Foundation.

Holly had the pleasure of serving as a Rotary Host Counselor for a human rights attorney from Italy, who was in the first class of the Rotary Peace and Conflict Management Program at UC Berkeley. She also served as Host Counselor for an Ambassadorial Scholar from Argentina. In their international Rotary work, Holly and Keith have traveled to Costa Rica, Panama, Ecuador and Project Amigo in Colima, Mexico.
