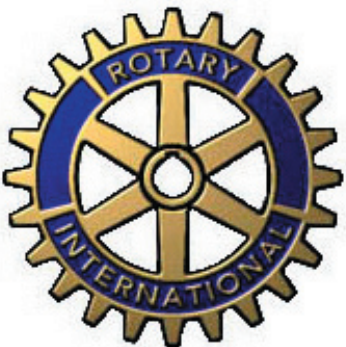

San Carlos Police Chief Greg Rothaus

Chief Greg Rothaus was appointed to his current position in February 2005. He began his career with the San Carlos Police Department back in 1985 and worked in numerous assignments including Patrol Officer, Field Training Officer, DARE Instructor, and Reserve Program Coordinator.

From 1988 – 1990, he was assigned as a Special Agent with the San Mateo County Narcotics Task Force. While in that capacity, Greg worked extensively in undercover operations in East Palo Alto and Redwood City. This assignment put Greg on the front lines of the drug wars during one of the most

violent periods in the history of San Mateo County.

After nine years as an officer, Greg was promoted to Sergeant and helped to develop the first Citizen's Police Academy in San Carlos. In 1996, he left San Carlos P.D. to pursue a promotional opportunity.
