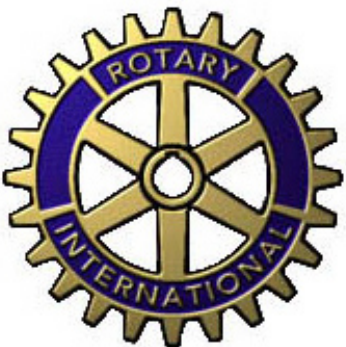

## Mark Schiavenza to speak on Endowment

 Best Beverly Hillbillies moment  
 They never moved back to California, and they certainly never built a mansion with a “cee-ment” pond, but Rotarians in northern Michigan did find black gold one day. The tale starts back in 1923, when members of the Rotary Club of Traverse City, Mich., USA, paid \$1,100 for 450 acres and leased the property to the Boy Scouts. The foresight they showed when retaining mineral rights to the land in the 1950s paid off in July 1976, when oil and gas were discovered on the property. Being Rotarians, of course, they didn’t squander the money,

but instead created a foundation and agreed to allow drilling only after ensuring protection for the camp’s environment. To date, the group has awarded \$35 million in grants for causes such as affordable housing, education, health, the environment, and community building.

The organization played a key role in

funding New Designs for Growth, a regional land use initiative that looks for innovative ways to protect and preserve the communities of northwestern Michigan, home to the majestic Sleeping Bear Dunes National Lakeshore.

Recent grants include \$400,000 for the construction of the Goodwill Inn to serve homeless families and \$100,000 for a new building for the Great Lakes Children's Museum. A variety of grants ranging from \$15,000 to \$25,000 support the Traverse Symphony Orchestra, the Grass River Natural Area, and Community Reconciliation Services.

And those Boy Scouts? They still lease land from the Traverse City Rotarians to run Camp Greilick, named for the club's third president, Clarence Greilick.
