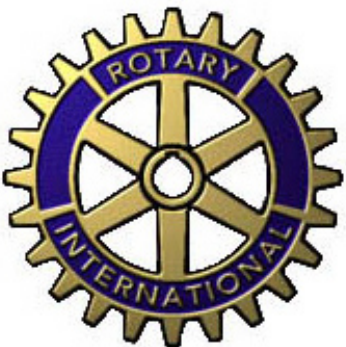

## Les May to be Honored Today

Les May was born in Sioux Falls, SD and went to Sioux Falls High School. He turned 19 just a month before the attack on Pearl Harbor. In April of 1942, Les joined the United States Marine Corp, and served as a Gunnery Sergeant. He trained at Camp Pendleton Marine Corps Base near San Diego and was later a member of a top fighting group, the Carlson Raiders.

Presidential Unit Citations and 9 medals for bravery.

Les stayed in the Marine Corps for one year of the Korean War. He saw a lot of action during that relatively short time. In his battalion 4 sergeants were killed and our Les had to assume leadership of the company.

#### ***Today's speaker: Sister Mary George O'Reilly***

has been a member of the Society of the Holy Child Jesus for 68 of her 88 years. A 1938 graduate of Rosemont College, Rosemont, PA with a baccalaureate degree in Chemistry, Sister earned her Master's degree in Chemistry from Catholic University of America and her doctorate in Chemistry from Fordham University.

Following upon her years as a faculty member of the Chemistry Department at Rosemont College, Sister was appointed Dean of the college in 1956 and President of the College, from 1962 to 1971. She was the first woman named as Trustee of Villanova University

where she served for ten years.

Further service of the community and the Church involved her as member of the long-range planning office of the Archdiocese of Newark, and as Director of Administration of the Archdiocese, and Secretary for Education.

In 1982, Sister Mary George returned to Rosemont College as Director of the Capital Campaign and served subsequently as Executive Assistant to the Presidents of Rosemont until her retirement in 2003 at age 85.

Since then she has undergone training for prison ministry and participated actively as a volunteer in the Thresholds Program in Prison Ministry in the G. I. Hill Correctional Facility, the county prison of Delaware County, Pennsylvania.

Sister Mary George has presented this program to the Rotarians in Merion, Pennsylvania and looks forward to the opportunity to share it now with you.
